## The English Baccalaureate (EBacc)

In order to achieve the English Baccalaureate qualification, pupils will need to select and complete GCSE qualifications in the following subjects:

- English Language
- English Literature
- Mathematics
- Science (either GCSE Combined Science or 3 single sciences)
- Geography or History
- A Modern Foreign Language (French or Spanish)

## The Advantages of the EBacc

- Studies show that options students select at GCSE play a key role in determining their opportunities beyond school
- The subjects combined in EBacc study offer a broad and balanced curriculum, building a wide range of skills and knowledge
- Research by the UCL Institute of Education has found that studying for the EBacc provides pupils with greater opportunities in further education, increasing the likelihood that they will stay on in full-time education
- Russell Group universities say that the EBacc is made up of the subjects that open more doors to more degrees
- Sutton Trust research has found that studying EBacc subjects can help improve a pupil's performance in English and maths


## GCSE English Baccalaureate (EBacc)

The EBacc is made up of the subjects which are considered essential to many degrees and open up lots of doors.

A study by the UCL Institute of Education shows that studying subjects included in the EBacc provides students with greater opportunities in further education and increases the likelihood that a pupil will stay on in full-time education.

Sutton Trust research reveals that studying the EBacc can help improve a young person's performance in English and maths.

The government's ambition is to see $90 \%$ by 2025 studying EBACC subjects

## Guided Choices Evening - 17th January

During the PPC evening you will have the opportunity to talk to your existing teachers about their subjects, there will also be information about new subjects and a chance to make appointments with teachers for subjects not studied in year 9 (Business \& Media).

Guide Choices goes live on Sims Online, Friday 26th January
Completion of Guided Choices Form, 23rd February
The online form needs to be completed by 23/2/24.

## Key Information

- You now have approximately a month to choose your options
- DO NOT RUSH
- Don't complete your choices too early, in case you change your mind. Keep asking questions and talking to your teachers
- Speak to your teachers and tutors if you have any queries
- Your parents must sign (electronic tick in a box) your Guided choices form
- Don't pick subjects because of a friend or the teacher!


## Pathway 1 - Target grades 6+

- In addition to the core subjects (Maths, English and Science) pupils must select
- Either Geography or History
- Either French or Spanish
- Then a free choice of 2 other subjects.
*During the PCC evening you will have a booked time with a member of the leadership team to discuss your pathway.


## Pathway 2 - Target grades 4-5

- In addition to the core subjects (Maths, English and Science) pupils must select
- Either Geography, History, French or Spanish
- Then a free choice of 3 other subjects
- We still strongly encourage all pupils in pathway 2 to select either Geography or History and French or Spanish
- *During the PCC evening you will have a booked time with a member of the leadership team to discuss your pathway.


## Pathway 3 - Target grades 3

- In addition to the core subjects (Maths, English and Science) pupils must select
- Either Geography or History or Spanish or French.
- Then 2 further free choices.
*Please speak with Mr Fowler (our SENCO for secondary) about the PIP provision.
*During the PCC evening you will have a booked time with a member of the leadership team to discuss your pathway.

Attending school every day $=100 \%$ attendance

Attending $41 / 2$ days a week $=90 \%$ attendance $=4$ weeks missed per year

Attending 4 days a week $=80 \%$ attendance $=$ more than half a term missed per year.

Attending $3 ½$ days each week $=70 \%$ attendance $=$ more than a quarter of the school year missed. An average attendance of $80 \%$ or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.
