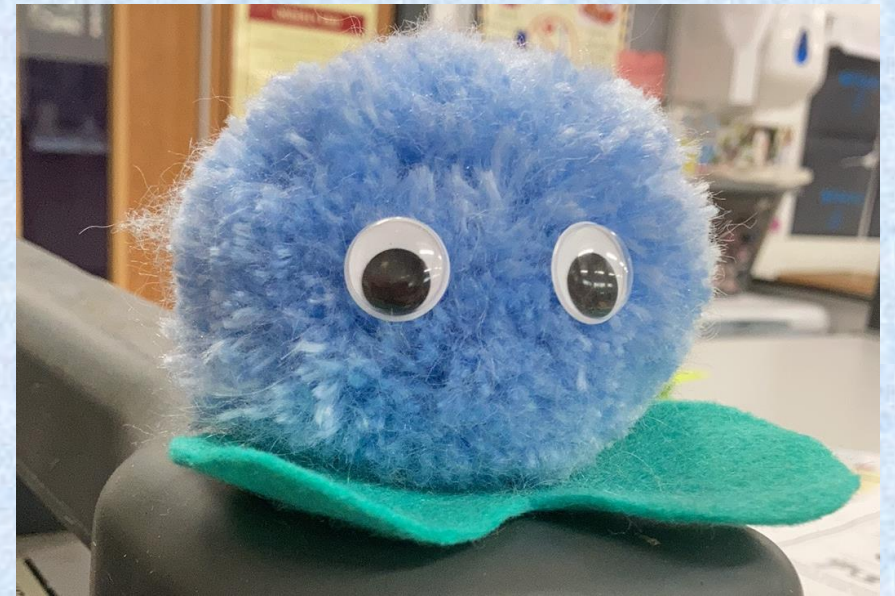


# The FUZZY project

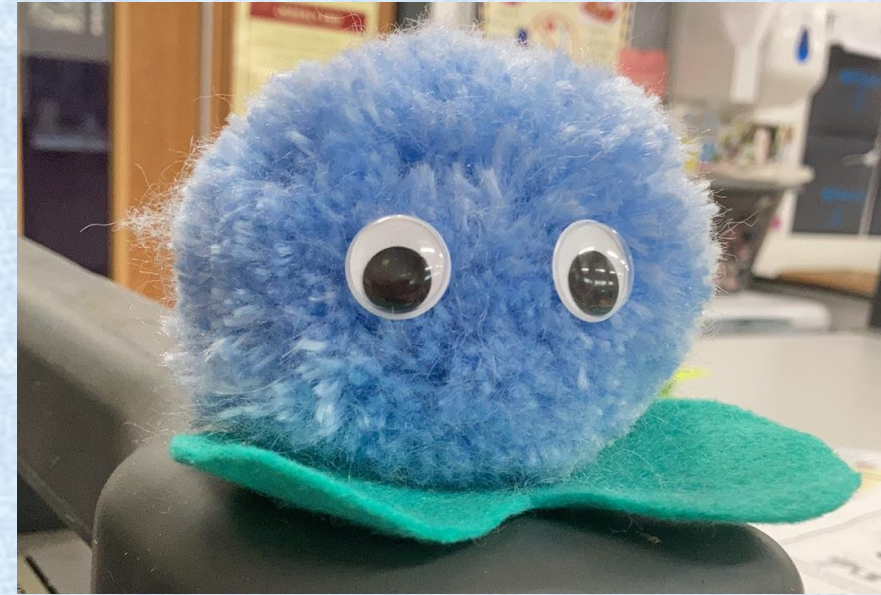




# What is the Fuzzy Project?

# How do I join in?

You will need:

- Small ball of wool
- Small piece of felt or foam
- 2 googly eyes
- RAK note
- Safety note
- Poly pocket



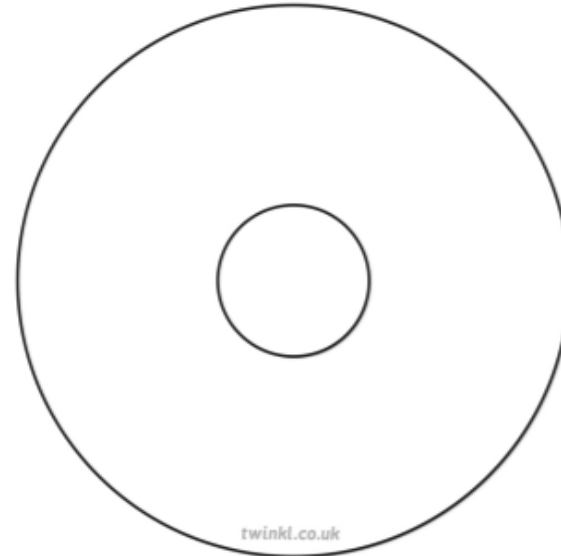
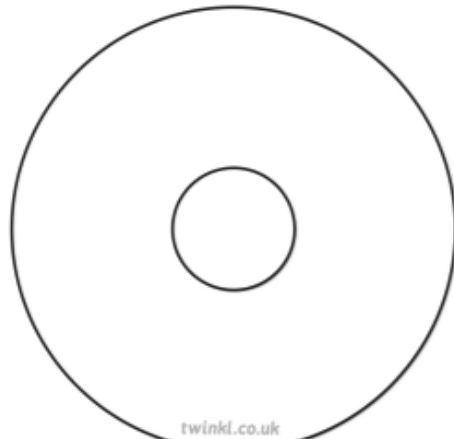
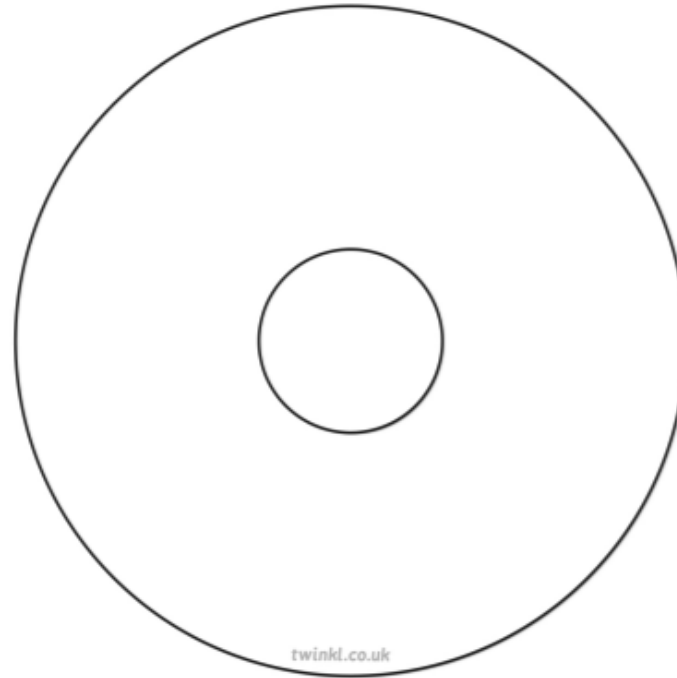
## Instructions

1. Make a pom pom with wool using the instructions and template sheet attached in the next slide.
2. Cut out little feet for your pom pom from either felt or foam and glue it onto the bottom
3. Glue on googly eyes to the middle of the pompom.
4. If you wish to decorate the fuzzy friend, please do! Have fun and be creative, if you would like to make more, please do!
5. Cut out the paper information and place it inside the poly pocket.
6. Place fuzzy friend in pocket and seal shut with tape.
7. Go out for a walk and hide the fuzzy friend in the community to make someone smile 😊  
remember you will need parent/ carer permission (older students) or a parent/ carer to go for a walk with you (younger students)

## Pom Pom Rings Templates

1. Decide what size pom pom you would like.
2. Use the correct sized ring template to draw two rings onto stiff card.
3. Carefully cut these rings out and place together back to back.
4. Tie the end of your wool so that it goes through the middle of the ring and then repeatedly loop the wool through the ring and round the card so that you will eventually have a layer of wool over your ring shape.
5. Continue to loop wool until the hole in the middle is much smaller.  
The more times you do it the fuller your pom pom will be!
6. Take a pair of scissors and cut the wool along the edge of the ring so that the scissors fall in between the two card board rings and they are left in one piece. Cut all the wool so that they are held together only by the ring.
7. Gently pull the rings apart and tie a small amount of wool tightly around the middle of the wool in between the rings.
8. Pull the rings away completely so that you are left with your pom pom.
