



UNIFORM POLICY

High standards of presentation are required at all times when wearing the school uniform. Whenever the school uniform is worn, it must be complete and not mixed with non-uniform clothing. This includes travel to and from school, at which times the uniform must be worn.

Where there is a matter of sincere religious observance, the Principal may grant exceptions to aspects of the uniform requirements.

Items marked with an asterisk are only available from School Colours Direct via the School website

General Requirements for all Pupils

- No denim/leather jackets or hoodies worn with the school uniform at any time (except during PE).
- All outer wear such as coats, scarves and hats to be removed inside the school building.
- No visible make-up is allowed, including nail varnish, false nails, fake eye-lashes, eye make-up, foundation, lip-gloss, lipstick, glitter etc. Nails must be of a safe length.
- A wristwatch and small single stud earring in each ear are the only permitted jewellery. No other facial studs or similar are allowed.
- Hair, including facial hair, must be kept tidy. Extremes of style are not permitted; this includes shaved patterns (including eyebrows), or unnatural colours.
- Only plain and simple hair ties are permitted.
- For Years 5-11, blazers must be worn at all times moving around school – unless permission is granted by the Principal on exceptionally hot days. Pupils may remove their blazers in lessons with the permission of their teacher.
- Belts are permitted, but must be black, formal, and plain in design with a plain buckle.
- Primary pupils may use a CFS bookbag. Otherwise, and for Secondary pupils, plain and sensible school and PE kit bags are required.

Years R-2

School uniform:

- Red CFS jumper*
- White polo shirt
- Plain knee length or longer formal black skirt OR plain black formal trousers, loose fitting at the ankle and touching the shoe. Both in specified styles – **see pictorial guide for acceptable and unacceptable styles**
- Black or white socks (no trainer socks) or black opaque tights
- Plain black flat formal school shoe, safe for school use. No trainers (including Nike Air Force Ones), boots or canvas shoes.

School uniform from Easter until October half term; pupils MAY wear the following instead:

- *Plain black formal cotton shorts with white polo shirt*
- *Red gingham dress*
- *Short white socks*
- *Plain black flat formal school shoe, safe for school use (no trainers, boots or casual shoes)*

PE kit:

- Red CFS sports polo shirt*
- Black CFS sports shorts*
- Red CFS hoodie*
- Plain black leggings or tracksuit bottoms
- White sports socks
- White or black sports trainers with non-marking soles

Years 3-6

School uniform:

- Red CFS jumper (optional)*
- Dark grey CFS blazer (two styles/cuts available)* (**YEARS 5 and 6 ONLY**)
- White long or short sleeved school shirt, with top button, tucked into skirt or trousers
- House tie (clip on available as an option)*
- Plain knee length or longer formal black skirt OR plain black formal trousers, loose fitting at the ankle and touching the shoe. Both in specified styles – **see pictorial guide for acceptable and unacceptable styles**
- Black or white socks (no trainer socks) or black opaque tights
- Plain black flat formal school shoe, safe for school use. No trainers (including Nike Air Force Ones), boots or canvas shoes.

School uniform from Easter until October half term; pupils MAY wear the following instead:

- *Plain black formal cotton shorts*
- *Red gingham dress*
- *Short white socks*
- *Plain black flat formal school shoe, safe for school use (no trainers, boots or casual shoes)*

PE kit:

- Red CFS sports polo shirt*
- Black CFS sports shorts or skort*
- Red CFS hoodie*
- Outdoor PE top (optional)*
- Plain black leggings or tracksuit bottoms
- Black or red knee length sports socks
- White or black sports trainers with non-marking soles

Years 7-11

School uniform:

- Dark grey CFS blazer (two styles/cuts available)*
- Grey CFS jumper (optional, but no other jumper allowed)*
- White long or short sleeved school shirt, with top button, tucked into skirt or trousers
- House tie (clip on available as an option)*
- Plain formal black skirt OR plain black formal trousers, loose fitting at the ankle and touching the shoe. Both in specified styles – **see pictorial guide for acceptable and unacceptable styles.** *Please note that the skirt must be no more than 2 inches above the knee.*
- Black or white socks (no trainer socks) or black opaque tights
- Plain black flat formal school shoe, safe for school use. No trainers (including Nike Air Force Ones), boots or canvas shoes.

School uniform from Easter until October half term; pupils MAY wear the following instead:

- *Plain black formal cotton shorts may be worn.*

However, on particularly hot days/weeks, the Principal may allow pupils to remove ties and blazers.

PE kit:

- Red CFS sports polo shirt*
- Black CFS sports shorts or skort*
- Outdoor CFS PE top* OR plain black sports hoodie or sweatshirt (optional)
- CFS Sports fleece and tracksuit bottoms (2 styles)* (optional)
Or plain black tracksuit bottoms or sports leggings
- Black or red knee length sports socks
- White or black sports trainers with non-marking soles
- Studded boots for the field (when advised by PE staff)
- Custom-fit mouth guard for sports such as Hockey and Rugby (when advised by PE staff)
- Shin pads for Hockey and Rugby
- Moulded plastic studded boots or astro trainers for wet weather use on the astro pitch (optional)

If pupils wish to wear visible base layers under their PE kits, these must be plain black.
