Practice column subtraction with your tens and ones, then have a go at drawing them out. Once you have done this, practise column addition with just numbers. Why don't you use a dice to generate your numbers and make some column subtraction questions of your own. You can either draw on counters or make your own out of card/paper. Once you have had a go with counters, practise by drawing out the counters. Then have a go practising with just the numbers. You can either draw on counters or make your own out of card/paper. Once you have had a go with counters, practise short division drawing out the counters. Then have a go practising with just the numbers.
