You can either draw on counters or make your own out of card/paper. Once you have had a go with counters, practise short division drawing out the counters. Then have a go practising with just the numbers. <p>Column addition and subtraction Practise using column addition and subtraction for numbers with up to seven digits. Don't forget to include decimal numbers too! Challenge - can you include a calculation with a negative number? Can you find different fractions/percentages of this amount?</p>

Practise your spellings and reading daily, then choose a writing or comprehension task to spend approximately 1 hour completing.

<p>Spelling</p> <p>Practise the spelling rule you are currently learning in class.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Practise adding suffixes like ing, ed, able/ible, er, est, ly.• Can you correctly convert expanded forms to contractions and vice versa? e.g. will + not = won't could + have = could've <p>Check the words on the Year 3/4 or 5/6 spelling lists (at end of this document). Choose 10 which you don't know and practise these. Once you have learnt them, choose another 10.</p>	<p>Reading</p> <p>Read your reading book with a grown up at home - at least around 10 pages of your book per day.</p> <p>Activity Ideas</p> <p>Choose 5 words from your reading today -can you find a synonym and antonym for each.</p> <p>Note down any new vocabulary as you read and create your own glossary.</p> <p>Write a character profile or setting description based on your reading.</p> <p>If you have finished a chapter, predict what might happen next using evidence from the text.</p> <p>If you finish you book complete an accelerated reader quiz. You could also write a book review.</p> <p>You can also quiz books you have been reading at home.</p>
